



Rules for CCLS Winter Olympics

Increase your greeting card sales with some competitive fun!

Governing entity:

The Fundraising Committee is the governing entity over the CCLS Winter Olympics. All its decisions are final.

The prizes:

Cash prizes will be given to the teams finishing in the first, second and third place positions. All prizes will be added to the funds each region receives at the completion of the greeting card fundraiser (when all the cards have been sold).

- The first place prize for winning the overall Olympics is \$40.00.
- The second place team will receive an additional \$25.00.
- The third place team will receive an additional \$15.00.

Teams:

Each region is its own team (country).

Goal:

The goal is to see which region can sell the most cards during each week to win a gold, silver or bronze medal. The team to accumulate the most medals over the eight weeks of the event is the CCLS Olympic champion.



Olympics: The CCLS Olympics run for eight weeks beginning on Monday, February 1 and ending on Sunday, March 28. The region that sells the most cards each week will be declared the gold medal winner of that week's featured event.

Weekly featured events:

2/1/10-2/7/10	LUGE
2/8/10-2/14/10	ICE HOCKEY
2/15/10-2/21/10	FIGURE SKATING
2/22/10-2/28/10	ALPINE SKIING
3/1/10-3/7/10	CURLING
3/8/10-3/14/10	BOBSLEDDING
3/15/10-3/21/10	SPEED SKATING
3/22/10-3/28/10	CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

Each week the region that sells the most sets of greeting cards will win the gold medal, the second place team silver and the third place team bronze. There will be no medals awarded if teams tie with no cards sold in the first, second or third position. At the end of the eight weeks the team that has accumulated the most metals will be the Olympic champion and win the additional money for client activities in their



region. As a number of teams will win a medal or tie for a medal each week; the final medal count will be decided on who has the most **gold** medal, if there is a tie then it will go to **silver** and finally to **bronze**.



EXAMPLE:	Gold	Silver	Bronze	TOTAL MEDALS
Southern	3	2	2	7
North Central	2	2	3	7
Western	2	3	2	7

The final standing would be Southern in First Place because they won the most gold medals followed by Western because they have won the most silver medals and then North Central.

If two or more teams are tied in the medal count, the next deciding factor will be total number of boxes sold for the entire event. If this also produces a tie, the tie will then be broken by a coin toss.

The Corporate Office is participating as well but they cannot win any of the positions, if they do sell enough cards to be in 1st, 2nd or 3rd place the team or teams below them will be the recipient of the cash prize.

Have fun:

Regions are encouraged to have fun with this event as the beneficiaries of this event are the clients whom you serve.
